1. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and accepted.
2. Jan Kiehl reported:
 - A. Small memorial in front of the Thornton Recreation Center that has Thomas J. Slocum's name on the backside.
 - B. We are allowed to have a booth at the Fourth of July celebration on the outside of the oval created by the sidewalks and we can have items to sell.
 - C. Pictures of Veterans on the Jumbotron will have to be started once it gets dark so they can be seen. After the Veterans' pictures have been displayed, there will be shown on the screen renderings of the park and the memorial.
 - D. Between 7:00 p.m. and 7:45 p.m. on the Fourth of July a radio personality will be introducing any World War II Veterans as well as Korean War Veterans.
 - E. At 7:45 p.m. on the Fourth of July the parachutists will drop in, the Color Guard will presents the flags, the National Anthem will be played with planes flying overhead. As the individual military service branch flags are presented their anthem will also be played.
 - F. Suggest having a model made by Greg Banks of the park and memorial for display was suggested.
3. Bob Heller reported:
 - A. Information about being in the Veteran's Day Parade has not arrived yet.
 - B. Large trailer is available to be in the parade.
 - C. Elks will supply flags, table and chairs for the booth at the Fourth of July celebration.
 - D. A ceremony was held to replace the POW/MIA flag at Ft. Logan.

- E. A vigil will be held Sunday, April 9, 2006 for missing Matt Maupin at 11:00 a.m. in Morrison, Colorado on the main street near the creek.
4. Martin Wisniewski reported that he has talked to the owner of Sun Honda about maybe doing something in conjunction with Rolling Thunder to act as escorts in the parade.
 5. Rebecca Cavanaugh-Miller said a sign on the north road of the park announcing that this is the future home of the Thornton Veterans' Memorial will be put in place once the road is constructed. There will be no sign on Colorado Boulevard.
 6. Martin Wisniewski will invite artists to come to the meeting on March 20th to discuss ideas for sculptures in the park.
 7. Per Kathy Grossman, Wal-Mart gave \$1,000.00 to Rolling Thunder.
 8. Rebecca Cavanaugh-Miller will get the price of the lighted flag pins to be sold at the Fourth of July celebration.
 9. A shirt price will be obtained from Jan Chambers. If we run out of shirts sizes at the Fourth of July celebration, orders can be taken. We will have to look to a corporate sponsor to help with the upfront cost of shirts.
 10. Trudie Schultz will get dates from the Elks to have fundraising dinners for the Thornton Veterans' Memorial.
 11. Rebecca Cavanaugh-Miller moved that the meeting be closed, Kathy Grossman seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned.
